WHITE ROSE ARCHERS 252 IMPROVEMENT AWARD

The 252 award is designed to help you practise your shooting at different distances and recognise your personal achievements. It is an award scheme in use at many archery clubs in the UK and applies to all archers, irrespective of age, ability or bow type (scores differ by bowtype). After 6 sighters, you shoot 3 dozen arrows on a 122cm face at your chosen distance. The round can be shot at 20, 30, 40, 50, 60, 80 or 100 yds – the goal is to score 252 or more (alternative scores apply for other bow types). When you have achieved that score twice (once for Juniors), you can claim a badge*.

The Rules:

- Six sighters to be followed immediately by 3 dozen scored arrows. These arrows may be shot alone or as the first 3 dozen of a longer Imperial round (in which case the scores need to be transferred to the 252 scorecard);
- GNAS 5-zone scoring using a 122cm target face;
- Badges may be claimed in any sequence;
- Scores need to be achieved twice to qualify for the award by Seniors, and once by Juniors (if under 18 at the time the round is shot);
- Qualifying scores for a given distance must be shot on different days;
- A distance award may be claimed multiple times if different bowstyles are used (recurve, longbow, compound, etc);
- Once you have two signed and witnessed scorecards, submit them with your cash to the Records Officer, to claim your badge.
- Please do not submit scorecards seperately, or if lower than the required scores.

The awards are as follows:

^{*}These are personal achievement awards and a charge of £2 per badge (£1.00 Juniors) is made to archers, however the first badge claimed will be free. To claim your badge, submit your "252 Scorecards" together with the cost of the badge, to the Records Officer.
